Follow the steps below to create your bookmark.



Choose 50mm tape size and alter the work space length to approximately 145mm



Choose, rotate and resize photo



Add a background and a frame



Add text, change the font, rotate, resize and reposition



Print, peel off the backing and add to co-ordinating card stock



Punch a hole in the top and tie a length of twine through it



Materials:

50mm tape

Card stock

Magnetic sheet

#### Step-by-step

Follow the steps below to create your 'Save the date'.



Choose 50mm tape size and alter the work space length to approximately 70mm



Choose, rotate and resize photo



Add first line of text, change the font, resize and reposition. Repeat on the other two lines using different fonts and sizes



Print, peel off the backing and adhere to card stock



Adhere this to a piece of magnetic sheet and trim



Follow the steps below to create your gift tag.



Prepare the tag



Create three faux washi tape border strips, approximately 70mm long. Create one for each of the different size tape widths and on the widest one type someone's name



Print all three and adhere them to the white tag, trimming the ends if necessary



Glue the white tag to a larger card stock layer



Punch a hole in the top centre and add the ribbon

# Notes & Stuff **Project 4** Notebook Materials: 9mm and 50mm tapes Notebook Scissors

#### Step-by-step

Follow the steps below to create your notebook.



With the 50mm tape installed and chosen on your design space, set the length to match your notebook size



Create a collage of photos, rotating, resizing and using the 'move to front' and 'move to back' feature, and then print



Using the 50mm roll again choose an image from one of the 'Art' categories. Resize, add text and then print leaving the backing paper in place



Cut this out



Create and print two 9mm border strips with a background design



Adhere all these to your notebook cover

## Laura **Project 5 Placecard** Materials: 50mm tape Card stock Craft knife Cutting mat Scissors

#### Step-by-step

Follow the steps below to create your placecard.



Create a folded place card and on the app select the the 50mm tape, adjust your work space to fit your card



Add your text, choose a font and alter the size and position



Add a frame to the outside edge and then print



Adhere to the folded placecard



Choose, resize and print a butterfly from the Easter category in 'Art'



Cut this out, adhere to the placecard overlapping the fold and use your craft knife and mat to cut around the part of the butterfly above the fold in order to create a pop-up effect



Follow the steps below to create your birthday card.



Select 50mm tape size and alter your work space to fit your card height



Design a random border strip, using images from 'Art', resizing, rotating, repositioning and duplicating using the 'stamp' function. Print your design



Choose a random image from the border strip. Enlarge it, print it and cut it out



Create a large number, rotating and changing the colour to fit your theme before printing and cutting out



Adhere the border strip to special effects card stock and then to your card



Remove the backing paper from the large number, adhere the cut-out robot image to the back, peeking out, and then lay onto your card



Create a greeting strip with the 19mm tape and your chosen background. Print and layer onto co-ordinating card stock and then to your card



Finish with a twine bow around the top of the card



Follow the steps below to create your bunting.



From 4" x 6" card stock pieces create bunting shaped cards



Using the 50mm tape, create your monogram letter blocks with a striped background frame from 'Christmas' and Old Standard TT Bold Font



Select, resize, print and cut out various images from 'Christmas' with the 50mm tape



Use the 9mm tape to create patterned border strips for the bunting pieces and for on the twine. Adhere the border strips to the top of the bunting card stock pieces



Mount the monogram frames to metallic card. Trim and adhere to the bunting. Glue the card stock offcuts (from step 1) to directly underneath the 9mm tape strips



Leave backing paper on the cut out images and use 3D foam pads to attach them to the bunting



Punch holes in the top corners of the bunting, thread twine through and add some faux washi border pieces, cut with a chevron shaped end to the twine. Finish with adhesive jewel gems and a faux stitched pen border

#### **Project 8** HOPPY Easter basket EASTER Materials: 25mm and 50mm tapes Card stock Scissors Paper trimmer/scorer Glue dots • Glue Circle/scalloped circle punch/die Scalloped square die • Twine

### Step-by-step

Follow the steps below to create your Easter basket.



Cut a piece of card stock 24cm x 24cm and score both ways at 80mm and 160mm. Cut as shown in the photo



Cut another piece of card stock 45mm, and as long as you like, border punch each long edge to form a handle



Use the 25mm tape to design a bunny border from the 'Happy Easter' category in 'Art', and 'Hoppy Easter' circle greeting from 'Circle Frames'. Print and cut out the circle greeting. Remove backing and adhere to punched or die cut circles



Use the 50mm tape to design and print four 50mm squares with a random bunny background and two 'bow' images from 'Easter'. Print and cut out the bows



Adhere the bunny border to the handle and the bunny squares to some precut/die-cut co-ordinating layers and then to the appropriate places on the basket piece



Construct the basket, add handle, bows, and the circle greeting hanging on twine as a tag



Follow the steps below to create your birthday card



Design and print out faux washi tape strips using the 9mm, 12mm and 19mm tape widths and add a text greeting to one of the widest strips



Start adhering these pieces from the bottom left of your card stock layer, piece, trim and reserve the excess pieces. Build up your design as desired



Choose and print out a number of flowers from 'Detailed Flowers' in 'Art' on the 25mm tape



Cut out and cluster toward the top left of the card stock



Adhere this layer to your base layer and embellish flower centres with glitter glue



Follow the steps below to create your baby mini book.



Cut two chipboard pieces to 70mm x 195mm and cover both with decorative paper



Cut decorative paper to 256mm x 192mm and score the long edge at 64mm, 128mm and 192mm. Cut the short edge at 64mm and 128mm. Cut two slits and fold back up as shown in the photo



Glue together
the two pieces at
the inside front
and back cover,
sandwiching a
piece of ribbon
each side to be
tied to keep the
book closed



Cut and glue down decorative paper squares to enhance the inside of the book



Design various background pieces, photo squares, images to cut out and faux Washi tape strips, some holding baby's details such as name, date of birth and weight



Decorate the mini book with these pieces using 3D foam pads to raise some to give dimension



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
